What is an Educational Degree Plan?

1	Q: What is an Educational Degree Plan?
	A: An Educational Degree Plan (EDP) is a detailed document that outlines all the remaining courses needed for you to complete your current program of study.
2	Q: Why do I need to do an EDP for financial aid?
	A: You've attempted 75% or more of your program of study. To ensure you complete your program of study within the maximum timeframe outlined in the federal regulations, we require an EDP.
3	Q: How do I complete an EDP?
	A: You should schedule an appointment with an academic advisor by calling (517) 483-1904. If you meet with someone outside of the Academic Advising Center (AAC), you will be required to make an appointment with AAC to have that EDP reviewed and processed.
4	Q: What happens if I do not complete the EDP prior to the semester requested?
	A: Once you've reached 75% or more of your program of study you will be required to complete an EDP. Until you satisfy this requirement, your financial aid will not disburse.
5	Q: What if my courses are pre-determined because I'm in the nursing program or other selective admissions program?
	A: You are still required to complete an EDP that details those courses you have remaining and when you will graduate.
6	Q: What if I've already completed an EDP?
	A: You can contact the Academic Advising Center at (517) 483-1904.
7	Q: How will financial aid know I've completed my EDP?
	A: If you met with the Academic Advising Center, they will notify the Financial Aid Office. If you meet with someone outside of the Academic Advising Center (AAC), you will be required to make an appointment with AAC to have that EDP reviewed and processed.
8	Q: What if I only have one semester remaining to complete my degree and/or transfer to another institution?
	A: You are still required to complete an EDP.
9	Q: What if I was previously in a certificate program but have since updated my program of study to an Associate degree?
	A: If you have attempted less than 120% of your program of study provide the Financial Aid Office with a print out of your Academic Progress tab from your Banner Self Service.
10	Q: I completed my associate degree and am pursuing a second degree. Do I still need to complete an EDP?
	A: Yes, you are still required to complete an EDP.
