Eligibility Criteria:

Education and Training Voucher (ETV): Offer up to \$4,000 towards school-related costs and living fees. It is for youth that were in foster care after the age of 14. You must receive your first ETV prior to your 21st birthday. You are then eligible until your 23rd birthday, provided you receive at least a 2.0 GPA and do not drop more than one class per semester.

Eligibility Criteria:

- ❖ Were in foster care on or after your 14th birthday because of abuse/neglect
- ❖ Were adopted from foster care on or after your 16th birthday
- ❖ Must have a high school diploma or GED
- ❖ Attend at least half-time, an accredited school that:
 - ❖ Awards a Bachelor's degree or no less than a 2-year program that provides credit towards a degree,
 - ❖ Provides no less than 1-year of training towards gainful employment, or
 - ❖ Is a vocational program that provides training for gainful employment and has been in existence for at least two years.

Gilman International Scholarship: Award recipients receive up to \$5,000 to apply toward study abroad program costs, including programs fees, tuition, room and board, airfare, books and local transportation.
